Children, let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth.

Now this is how we shall know that we belong to the truth and reassure our hearts before him in whatever our hearts condemn. for God is greater than our hearts and knows everything. Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have confidence in God and receive from him whatever we ask. because we keep his commandments and do what pleases him. And his commandment is this: we should believe in the name of his Son, Jesus Christ, and love one another just as he commanded us. Those who keep his commandments remain in him, and he in them. and the way we know that he remains in us is from the Spirit he gave us.

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
A reading from the holy Gospel according to John:

Jesus said to his disciples: "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine grower. He takes away every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and every one that does he prunes so that it bears more fruit. You are already pruned because of the word that I spoke to you. Remain in me, as I remain in you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing. Anyone who does not remain in me will be thrown out like a branch and wither: people will gather them and throw them into a fire and they will be burned. If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask for whatever you want and it will be done for you. By this is my Father glorified, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples."

Litany of Saints for Baptisms

At the end of the Prayer of the Faithful, we invoke the intercession of the Saints.



Outline of Baptismal Rite for Songleader

Once they have assembled, the celebrant prays the following prayers

- Prayer of Exorcism and Anointing
- Blessing and invocation of God over Baptismal Water
- Renunciation of Sin and Profession of Faith ("I do...")

<u>Baptism</u>

<u>Priest:</u> Is it your will, therefore, that **N**. should receive baptism in the faith of the Church, which we have all professed with you?

lt is.

N., I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Cantor gestures for assembly to sing the Baptism Acclamation; if the first response is weak, repeat.



The above acclamation is sung once after each baptism.

After all baptisms are finished, the following rites are performed:

- Anointing with Chrism
- Clothing with White Garment
- Presentation of Baptismal Candle
- Prayer over ears and mouth (Ephephtha)

The Celebrant than concludes:


Baptized in Christ, you are clothed with Christ.

THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

During the Offertory Song the gifts of bread and wine are brought in procession. The Priest offers the prayers of blessing quietly at the altar. The Priest completes additional personal preparatory rites, and the people rise as he says:

Pray, brethren (brothers and sisters), that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father.


May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church.

Then the Priest says the Prayer over the Offerings, at the end of which the people acclaim: **Amen.**


The Priest concludes the Preface with the people, singing:

Holy, Holy, Holy




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When We Eat This Bread

Lord Jesus Christ... ... Who live and reign for ever and ever.




After his private prayers of preparation the Priest genuflects, takes the host and, holding it slightly raised above the paten or above the chalice says aloud:
